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What Does AIG Look Like at Salem Elementary School?

The co-teaching AIG model is a county wide initiative and part of the WCPSS AIG plan. At Salem Elementary students are receiving AIG services for more than the required 45 minutes a week per identified subject area.

Through a combination of our pull-out and co-teaching practices, I am able to work with AIG identified students 5 times per week for 45 minutes in each identified subject area. The co-teaching model allows for lessons to be differentiated through content, process, and product. Benefits of co-teaching are:

- Reduced student/teacher ratio
- Increased instructional options for all students
- Diversity of instructional styles
- Greater student engaged time
- Greater student participation levels

Collaboration

How are our students at Salem Elementary collaborating across subjects in the school day? Collaborating across space and time is how the world works today. It's how business gets done.
